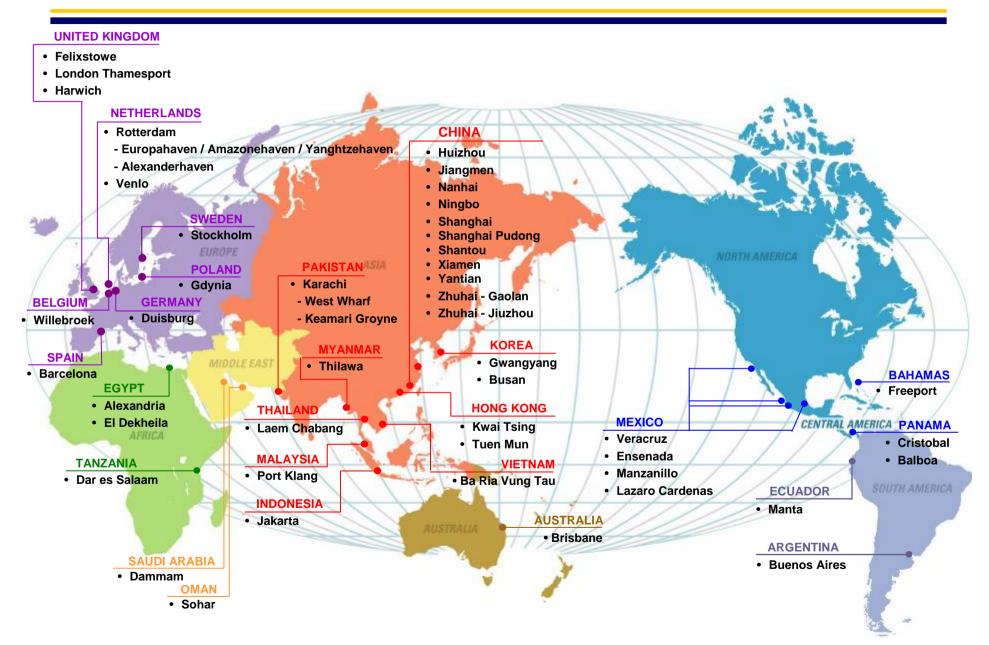
#### **Agreement Ports of Stockholm and HPH**



- The 25-year agreement grants HPH the right to operate the container terminal within Stockholm Free Port from 1 March 2009
- The agreement paves the way for HPH to develop new container-handling facilities at the Port of Nynashamn, Norvikudden
  - ➤ The terminal will cover an area of 25 hectares and will be developed in three phases with a quay length of 800 metres and a depth alongside of 15 metres.
  - ➤ The terminal is expected to be operational in 2012

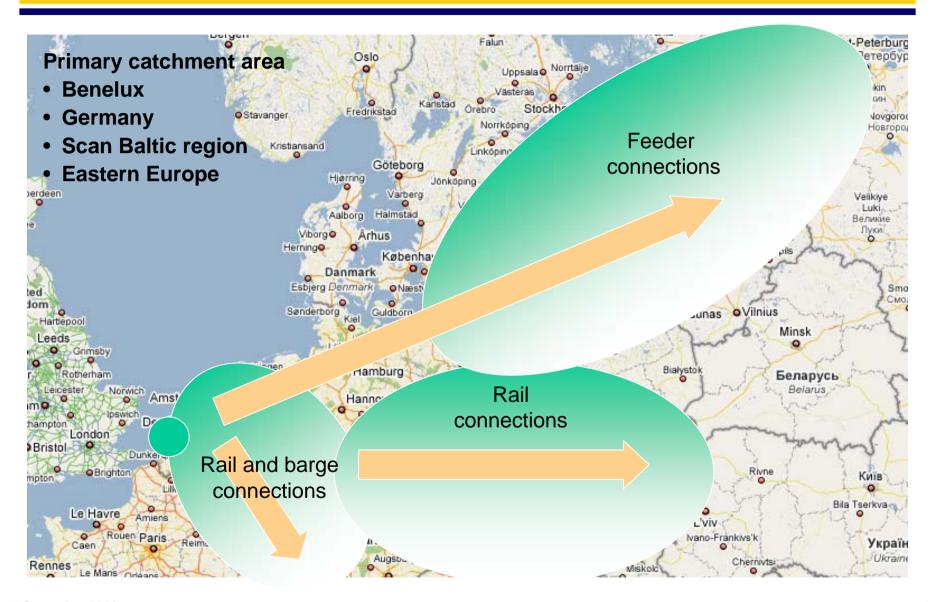

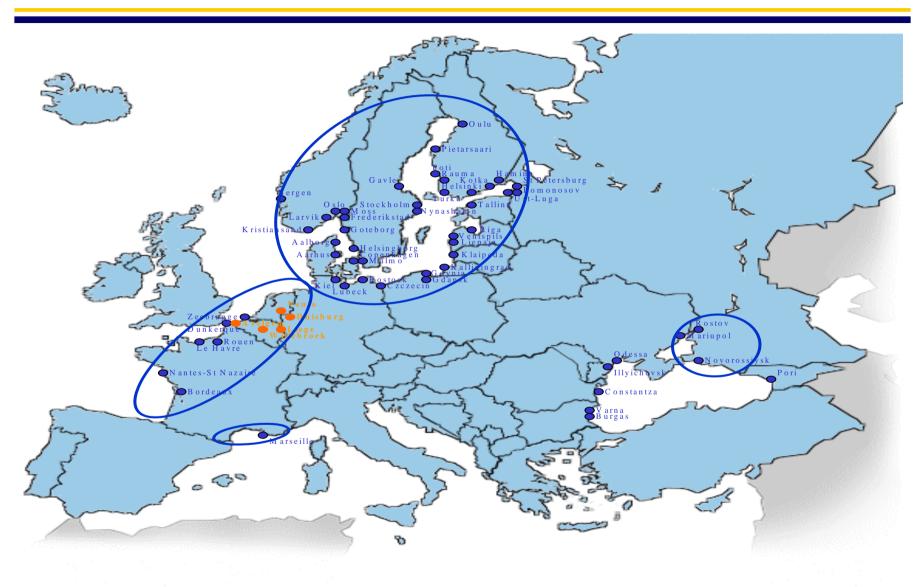

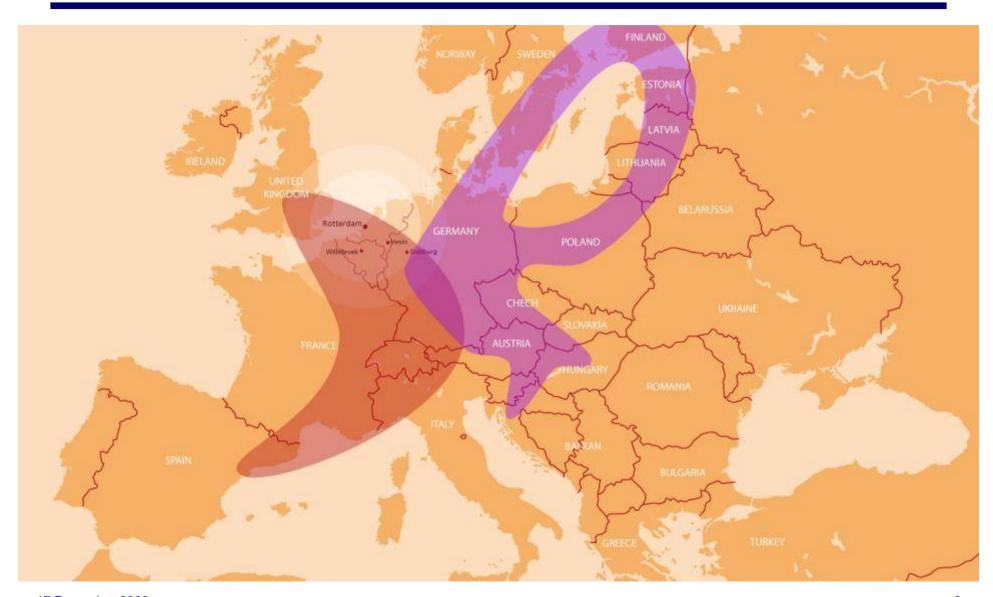
# **HPH Northern Europe**

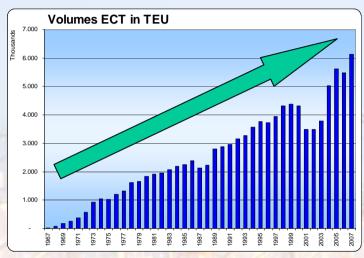
#### **Hinterland network of ECT**

- •17,000 trucks



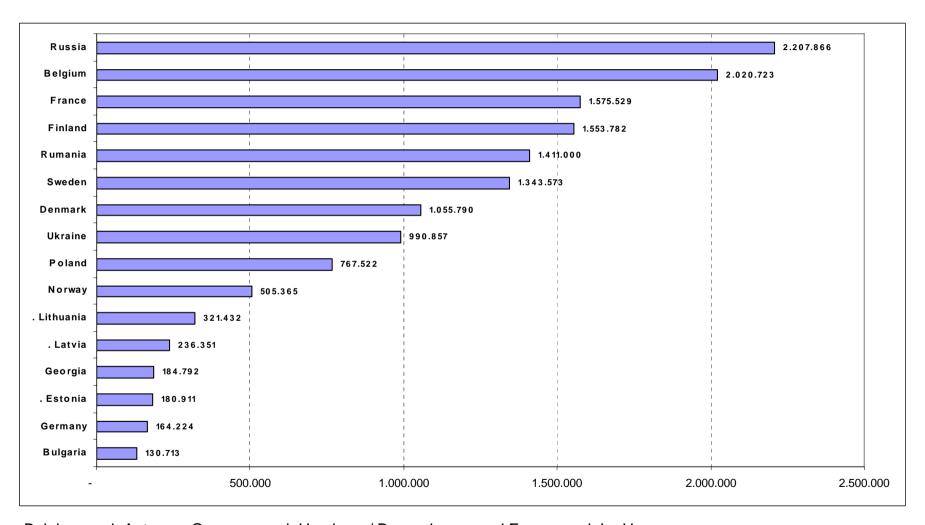
#### Port of Rotterdam:

  - ➤ High percentage GDP 40% of Sweden's GDP is generated in this area
