THE EUROPEAN CHARTER COMPLIANCE

The <u>European Charter</u> lays the basic criteria, which each participant must meet in order to participate to the event. Each and every local authority is encouraged to sign the Charter and commit itself to respecting the different requirements presented.

The Charter is identical for all local authorities that take part so that the event is truly international. In undersigning the European Charter for the European Mobility Week, we commit ourselves in:

- 1. organising a week long of activities, taking into account this year's focal theme: "Clever Commuting",
- 2. implementing one or several new practical measure(s), which is/are made permanent in the local authority and contribute(s) to modal transfer from the private car to sustainable modes of transport as well as to a more sustainable urban mobility in general,
- 3. organising the "In Town Without My Car!" event during the Mobility Week and preferably on the 22nd of September.

These requirements are wide enough to allow local authorities to act with a certain degree of flexibility. Indeed, they can easily adapt these requirements to their local constraints and challenges through the implementation of practical actions (new bus timetables, building of cycle paths, availability of cleaner vehicles, etc.).

PARTICIPATING OR SUPPORTING CITIES AND TOWNS?

A local authority can be registered as participating city or supporting city according to the level of commitment of the local coordinators.

A local authority that complies with all criteria of the European Charter for the European Mobility Week is considered as a participating city and a local authority that partially complies with the criteria is considered as a supporting city.

ANY LOCAL AUTHORITY is welcome to participate in the European Mobility Week.
